JESUS WAS SENSITIVE

Jesus was sensitive to people's needs. He identified with their problems. His compassion was demonstrated in His encounter with the woman caught in the act of adultery. By suggesting that the sinless among her accusers cast the first stone. He demonstrated the forgiveness and mercy each of us should extend to others.

Confronting the rich young ruler, He give another example of His understanding approach to the complex questions. Jesus understood all facets of human nature. His ability to penetrate the hearts and minds allowed Him to instruct in a life-changing way.

His ability is not restricted to the people of His time, but is available to every person of all time – including those of us living in this complex time.

People will listen to us if we convey sympathetic understanding. Christ—like empathy involves not just knowledge, about people, but a love for them. Without love, the faults and failures of others make us cynical, censorious, vindictive.

PREACHING THE WORD

Preaching is a tough job. No one like to make people feel uncomfortable, and that is what preaching the truth does many times. The apostle Paul said, "For I have not shunned to declare unto you all the counsel of God" (Acts 20:27).

All preacher face the temptation of preaching what people want – not what they need. God wants preachers in our pulpits preaching "thus saith the Lord," not politic preaching to please the people.

Paul told Timothy to preach the Word (II Timothy 4:2). He went on to say, "For there is going to come a time when people won't listen to the truth, but will go around looking for teachers who will tell them just what they want to hear" (II Timothy 4:3).

When you go to the doctor do you want him to give you what will make you well, or what you would like to take? It should be the same in regards to one preaching God's Word.

There are some subjects that are rarely preached today because they make people uncomfortable. Preaching about hell convicts the backslider, converts the sinner, and stirs Christians to remain faithful. Remember, Jesus taught more about hell than He did about heaven.

Folks really don't like sermons about sin. What is sin? Sin is disobeying God's commands. It is disobeying convictions and conscience. James tells that one who knows right and yet refuses to do right is committing sin (James 4:17). We also know that sin separates us from God (Isa. 59:1).

Space will not allow the listing all the subjects that people don't want the preacher to speak on. But, we must remember that God will judge Christians as well as preachers for how they obeyed God, for how they worked or refused to work, for words as well as thoughts. There will be regrets at the judgment along with tears.

Preachers need to peach the "whole councel of God" and let the chips fall where they may.
